## J. A. DE - MELLO J;

The Petitioner Juma Hamisi Mandaro has instituted this Petition since the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September 2019, moving the Court under section 8 of the Bankruptcy Act Cap. 25 R.E 2002, Rules 106,107, 108 and, 109 of the Bankruptcy Rules.

However, since the inception of the same on 3<sup>rd</sup> of November, 2019, to-date, the Petitioner has neither entered appearance nor submitted in as far as record is concerned. For clarity, it was ordered and in absentia, on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March, 2020 that, the said Petition be argued by writing for timely dispensation of justice. Ruling was slated for the 9<sup>th</sup> of April 2020. In absence of the same, the Court extended the Ruling to 18<sup>th</sup> of June 2020, but to no avail. This translates into Non compliance of Court of orders which attracts penalties as have been observed in several cases as was in the case of Director of Public Prosecutions vs. Said Saleh Ali, Criminal Appeal No. 476 of 2017, Court of Appeal of Tanzania at Zanzibar held that;

"...if a party fails to file his/her submission on scheduled date it is equated as if he/she has failed to appear on a hearing date with a consequence of dismissing the matter before the Court."

Hence, I accordingly dismiss the Petition simply for non compliance of Court orders, more so for **`Want of Prosecution'.** 

It is so ordered.
