Mtulya F.H., J.:

The applicant, Mr. Chenga Sauko preferred the present application seeking bail pending appeal in this court. The reasons of the application as displayed in chamber application filed by the applicant are two viz: first the offence of theft is bailable; and second, bail is a constitutional right.

Today, when the application was called for hearing, the applicant invited legal services of learned counsel Mr. Joseph Matimbwi to argue the application for him whereas the Republic enjoyed legal representation of learned State Attorney Ms. Elizabeth Muhangwa. During the hearing, Ms. Muhangwa supported the application by citing section 368 (1) (a) (i) of the **Criminal procedure Act** [Cap. 20 R.E 2019] (the Act) arguing that the provision allows bail in cases like the present one.

On my part, I have read Article 13 (6) (b) of the Constitution of the United Republic of Tanzania [Cap. 2 R.E. 2002) and section 368 (1) (a) (i) of the Act and think that the law is very certain in cases like the present one. I, therefore, decided to grant bail to the applicant pending his appeal. However, the applicant should fulfill the following listed bail conditions, namely:

- 1. The applicant must register two (2) reliable sureties;
- 2.The sureties must be citizens of Tanzania in possession of National Identification Card issued by National Identification Authority (NIDA);
- The sureties must register letters of introduction from their respective employers or village or street recognized authorities; and
- 4. These bail conditions shall be supervised by Deputy Registrar of this Registry in accordance to the laws regulating bail in this court.
