The late **ALEXANDER STEPHEN ZAMBETAKIS** died intestate on 1ST October 2021 at IST Clinic at Kinondoni, Dar es salaam. His wife **TSHEPISO BRENDA MAGOME** has petition for the grant of the letters of administration to administer his estate. The petition lacks the is supported by all the beneficiaries as signified by their written consent attached to this petition. The petition is not supported by the written consent of the beneficiaries as required under rule 71 (1) of the Probate Rules. The reason stated in the affidavit filed by the petitioner in lieu thereof as per rule 72(1) of the same Rules is that all the named heirs, Benita Lee Zambetakis (daughter), Mary Anne Zambetakis(daughter) and Christian

Alexander Zambetakis (son) are all residing outside Tanzania, in Finland, thus it has not been easy to procure their written consent. As the petition is also accompanied with the minutes of the family minutes dated 4 of January 2022 proposing the petitioner to petition for the letters I hereby dispense with the required written consent as the same can inferred from the minutes signed by all the beneficiaries in question. The petitioners submitted to have complied with citation order by publishing in the Government Gazette dated 1/4/2022 and Mwananchi Newspapers of 26/3/2022. So far, no caveat has been filed objecting the petition making the petition un-contentious. For the reason, this court finds no reason to withhold the grant. Therefore, appoint the petitioner, **TSHEPISO BREND A MAGOME** as a sole administrator of the estate of the late **ALEXANDER STEPHEN ZAMBETAKIS**.
