This Land Case was filed in this Court on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2020. However, after mediation and before a Final Pre – Conference, the parties on 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2022, prayed for several adjournments to settle the dispute. Finally, on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2022, Mr. Gwamaka Mwaikugile, learned counsel for the Plaintiff, and Ms. Neisha Shao and Mr. Jeremiah, learned State Attorneys for the Defendants, appeared before me and both parties entered into an

agreement to settle the dispute. To that effect, they prepared a Deed of Settlement duly signed by all parties, and the same was filed in Court on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2022. The two advocates representing the parties informed the Court that the matter should be marked settled since the parties have filed a "Deed of Settlement" in Court. The parties have further requested me to record it as one that brings the suit to an end.

I have looked at the Deed of Settlement filed in this Court and I am convinced that the Deed of Settlement does conform to the requirements of Order 23 Rule 3 of the Civil Procedure Code Cap. 33 [R.E. 2019]. I, therefore, proceed to record the Deed of Settlement as constituting a compromise of the entire suit which is now marked settled based on the terms appearing on the Deed of Settlement filed in this Court. The Deed of Settlement shall hence, therefore, be part and parcel of this Consent Judgment and Decree of the Court.

Order accordingly.
